Gerding Builders is fortunate to have a 2023 coaching staff with strong ties to American Legion baseball in general and the Marketmen program in particular. The group guiding this summer's team has a combined 35 seasons of coaching Corvallis American Legion baseball.

**LARRY BUMPUS, HEAD COACH:** Larry Bumpus steps into the head coaching role for Gerding Builders for the 2023 season but is not a newcomer to the Marketmen, having joined the Corvallis coaching staff in 2018.

A native of Southern California, Bumpus was a standout football, basketball, and baseball player at Oxnard High, where he was a quarterback, point guard and outfielder. He earned a football scholarship to Oregon State University, playing defensive back.

Bumpus has several years of coaching experience, including experience with Legion programs in the Salem area. He has coached football and baseball at Corvallis High. He enjoys working with young men and helping them develop into better athletes and, most importantly, into better young men.

"My job as a coach is to connect with each individual athlete in a positive way and help them grow to be the best version of themselves on and off the field," Bumpus said. "I like to emphasize the importance of communication, hard work, trust, integrity and teamwork."

Bumpus loves to spend time with his family and has the unique opportunity to work with his wife, Summer, every day. They own Oak Creek Collection, a shop featuring home and gift items inspired by the culture and people of the Pacific Northwest. Their son Azel played for the Marketmen in 2019 and 2021.

**EVAN HILBERG, ASSISTANT COACH:** Evan Hilberg moves into an assistant coaching role for 2023 after being Gerding Builders' head coach from 2017-22; prior to that he spent three seasons as an assistant coach for the Marketmen.

Hilberg rejoined the Marketmen in 2014 as an assistant coach; he had played pitcher and infielder for the team from 2006-2007, helping the Marketmen finish third in the state in 2006. He is a native of Corvallis and played football

and baseball for Corvallis High.

Hilberg wants to continue the on-field success of the Corvallis American Legion program, but also wants the Marketmen to learn lessons that go beyond the diamond.

"Once you leave the baseball diamond and hang up your cleats for the last time there's a lot more to life," Hilberg said. "So if they can pull out some of those values from baseball - working hard, being part of a team, dealing with adversity - into their life and careers, that would be a success for me."

Hilberg went on to play for Linfield College, from which he graduated with a degree in Exercise Science. While with the Wildcats, he earned All-Northwest Conference and All-West Region honors as a pitcher; Linfield twice advanced to the NCAA Division III World Series, placing third and fifth.

Hilberg earned his master's degree in Exercise Physiology and his PhD in Kinesiology at Oregon State University, with a focus on physical activity and public health. He works full-time as a health policy research analyst for Cambia Health.

Hilberg is also a head coach with the DSK Volleyball club. His coaching career started in the Corvallis Parks and Recreation Department, which led to involvement with Corvallis summer teams.

Hilberg and his wife Autumn have two sons, Felix and Rocco.

**JIM OWRE, ASSISTANT COACH:** Jim Owre returned to the Corvallis staff in 2012; he had previously been an assistant coach for the Marketmen from 2000-07, including the 2003 team that placed third at the American Legion World Series. His coaching career also includes stints as head coach at Crescent Valley and Taft high schools, where he had both schools in playoff contention.

Owre graduated from Oregon College of Education (now Western Oregon University) in 1977 and became a teacher and coach.

Owre began his involvement with the Marketmen when his son, Sam, had a standout career in the program from 1996-98. Owre and his wife, Dani, own the Family Sports Shop,

specializing in printing T-shirts and other athletic attire, in Independence.

**ERIC DAZEY, ASSISTANT COACH:**

Eric Dazey, a former Marketman player, comes back to the program as an assistant in 2023; he was also on staff from 2003-05, including the 2003 team that placed third at the American Legion World Series.

A mathematics teacher at Corvallis High, Dazey coached the Spartans from 1992-96 and 2002-13, including guiding CHS into the state championship game in 2009. He has also coached at Tigard and Southridge high schools in the Portland area, winning several coach of the year honors during his career. In addition to his baseball coaching he has been an assistant football coach at several schools.

A graduate of Crescent Valley High, Dazey played for the Marketmen in 1985 and pitched two seasons for Oregon State University, from which he graduated in 1990.

Dazey and his wife, Emily, have two daughters, Anna and Rachel.

**AZEL BUMPUS, ASSISTANT COACH:**

Azel Bumpus joined the Gerding Builders staff for the 2022 season, coaching alongside his father Larry. Bumpus played for the Marketmen in 2018, 2019 and 2021; if not for the COVID-19 pandemic wiping out the 2020 season Bumpus would have been a rare four-year player in the program.

Bumpus graduated from Corvallis High in 2020. As a junior in 2019, he was All-Mid-Wilamette Conference second team as an infielder. He went on to play at Chemeketa Community College.

**COOPER HARTSELL, ASSISTANT COACH:** After playing for the Marketmen in 2019, Cooper Hartsell became part of the Gerding Builders staff in 2022 alongside his father Chad. He also played Legion baseball for the Mid-Valley Southpaws of Albany.

Cooper graduated from West Albany High in 2018, earning All-Mountain Valley Conference honors as an infielder. He went on to play at Umpqua Community College.

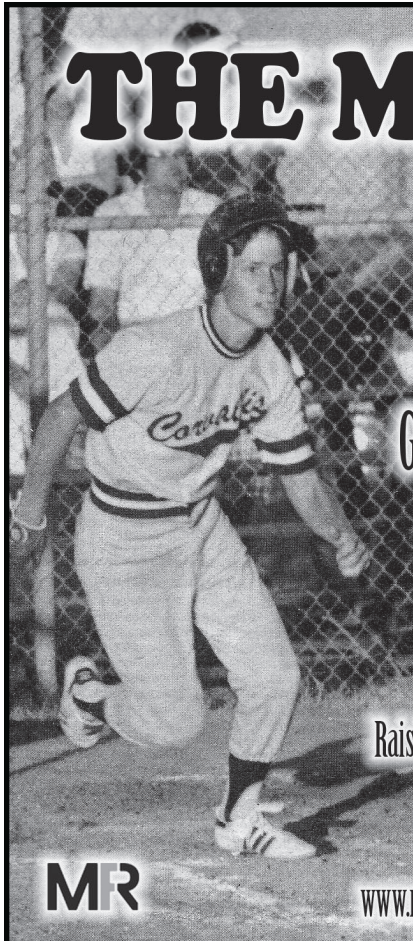

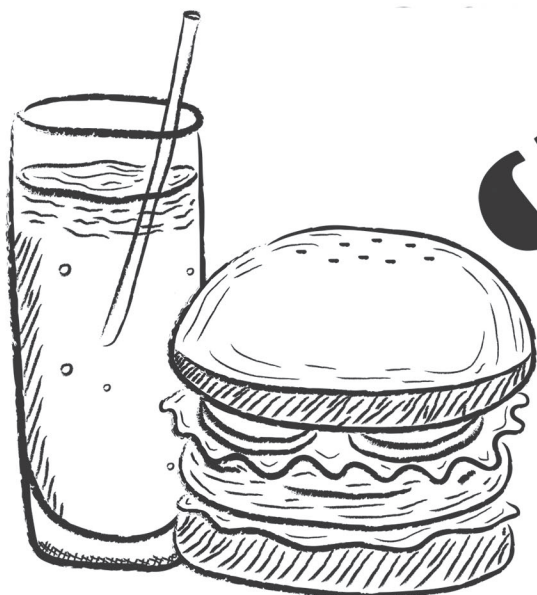

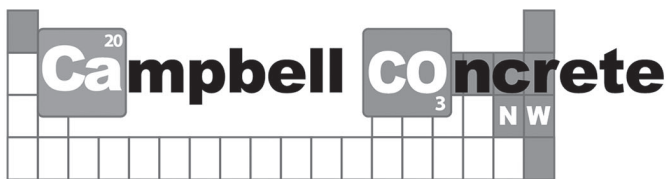

# HANSEN STADIUM AT TAYLOR FIELD



## The ballpark now (above) and the planned work (below)

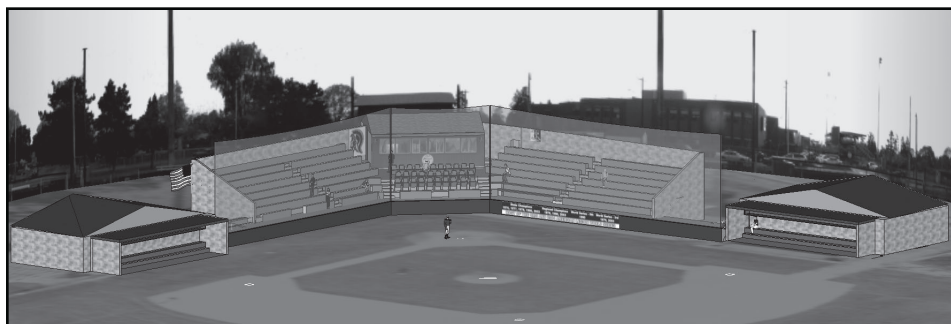
Hansen Stadium at Taylor Field was created and improved through the work of Corvallis and Benton County baseball fans, and another community effort is underway to restore the facility to being a showplace of the game.

The ballpark has been the home of American Legion baseball in Corvallis since 1949. It hosted the American Legion World Series in 1990 and 2004, and has also been the site of several Northwest Regionals and Oregon state tournaments.

The diamond at 16th and Buchanan is where dozens of players began working their way toward collegiate and professional baseball careers. Several of those local products eventually reached the major leagues: Kevin Gregg, Don Reynolds, Harold Reynolds, Dave Roberts, Mike Thurman and Jim Wilson, and Dan Williams made the majors as a coach.

Work is currently underway to return Hansen Stadium at Taylor Field's spectator areas to the condition fans enjoyed from the 1980s through the 2000s. Fundraising is underway to eventually provide a concrete base, steel grandstands with a brick facade and storage areas.

Work already completed includes a complete renovation of the playing surface, including new irrigation and drainage systems; new dugouts; a seating berm; and preliminary work on the ground that will be beneath the grandstand. The ballpark's lighting system was renovated in 2020, as that portion of the project was included in a 2018 school district bond measure.



The story of Hansen Stadium at Taylor Field goes back to 1944, when Harold and Clara Taylor sold the parcel of land to the Corvallis School District for \$10. It became an athletic field in 1948, with the baseball diamond taking shape in 1949; the first game on the site was Corvallis High's 4-3 win over Springfield on April 15, 1949.

Community donations and labor led to numerous improvements over the years. Most notable were the press box/concession stand built in 1983 and a set of grandstands seating 2,000 completed in 1985; for the 1990 ALWS, temporary seating pushed the capacity to 5,000.

The first set of lights was installed in 1953, with a new set taking its place in 1976 and being upgraded in 1980 then renovated in 2020. The ballpark got its first electronic scoreboard in 1976; new ones were installed in 1986, 1996 and 2022.

In 2001, the ballpark was renamed Hansen Stadium at Taylor Field in honor of longtime

American Legion volunteers Gene and Helen Hansen. In 2004, Gene passed away when he suffered a heart attack working on the ballpark in preparation for that year's ALWS.

In 2009, the 1980s wooden grandstand was deemed unsafe and had to be removed. Temporary seats were installed for that season's Oregon state tournament - won by Corvallis - and work began on raising funds for rebuilding.



# AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL HISTORY

American Legion Baseball is a national institution, having thrived through a world war, several national tragedies, and times of great prosperity as well as great despair.

The league still stands atop the traditional values upon which it was founded 98 years ago. Since 1925, American Legion Baseball has taught hundreds of thousands of young Americans the importance of sportsmanship, good health and active citizenship. The program is also a promoter of equality, making teammates out of wealthy bankers' and industrial workers' sons, and erasing any social divide between them. Most importantly, American Legion Baseball has been, and continues to be, a stepping stone to manhood for millions of young men who have gone on to raise families or play the sport at the highest level.

**A MODEST BEGINNING:** Community service has always been a core value of The American Legion. In 1925, this commitment was furthered to include a junior baseball program.

The league was first proposed at an American Legion state convention in Milbank, S.D., when Sioux Falls attorney and department commander Frank G. McCormick invited his close friend, Maj. John L. Griffith, to address the convention. Instead of a traditional speech, Griffith, who was also the collegiate commissioner of the Western Conference (now the Big Ten), spoke about athletics' role in the development of youth.

"The American Legion could well consider the advisability of assisting in the training of young Americans through our athletic games," Griffith said. Athletic competition teaches courage and respect for others, fostering their growth into active citizens, he said.

The South Dakota convention agreed and promptly passed a resolution urging the Legion to create an organized summer baseball league that started each June. National Commander James A. Drain backed the resolution, which passed that fall at the Legion's national convention in Omaha, Neb. The first program in the world to provide a national baseball tournament for teenagers, American Legion Baseball was born.

In 1926, posts in 15 states organized and sponsored teams, drafted local schedules and conducted championship tournaments. Postseason tournaments at the state, sectional and regional levels culminated with a national championship. Only a few changes have been made to the format over the years. The tournament still has a similar setup: 64 teams play at eight regional sites, with eight teams going on to the World Series. The winning team receives a trip to Major League Baseball's World Series, a tradition dating back to 1926.

**A LITTLE HELP FROM THEIR FRIENDS:** The first American Legion Baseball World Series was held in Philadelphia in 1926. Yonkers, N.Y. Post 321 beat a team from Pocatello, Idaho.

In 1927, the Legion's national convention convened in Paris. With the organization's financial coffers stretched thin from the trip's expenses, the Legion couldn't fund a World Series. No champion was named and the future of American Legion Baseball looked bleak.

But the Legion's Americanism director, Dan Sowers, worked to keep the league afloat. The tournament format needed \$50,000, and Sowers was determined to raise it. Early in 1928, he went to an executive meeting for professional baseball, hoping to reach a sympathetic ear. He found one in Commissioner Kenesaw Mountain Landis, who pledged a \$50,000 annual donation from Major League Baseball. Legion Baseball resumed in 1928, and by 1929 participants were coming from every state and the District of Columbia.

Like other institutions, Legion Baseball fell on tough times during the Great Depression. In 1933, MLB's funds were gone and the annual \$50,000 donation was pulled, and it looked likely the national tournament would be abandoned indefinitely.

Again, Sowers set out to find a generous sponsor. He turned to Frank

Knox, a newspaper publisher and former department commander. Knox contributed \$5,000 and gave Sowers letters of introduction to several other newspaper publishers. An additional \$28,500 was raised in donations from several newspapers and Sowers received the final \$6,500 from his own boss, Col. Henry L. Doherty, president of Cities Services.

MLB resumed its funding in 1935, starting with a \$20,000 donation and working back up to the original amount. Professional baseball now contributes \$40,000 yearly, or about 3 percent of the total budget.

**THE MODERN ERA:** American Legion Baseball enjoys a reputation as one of the most successful and tradition-rich amateur athletic leagues. Today, the program registers over 5,400 teams in all 50 states, including Canada and Puerto Rico. Almost 100,000 youths, ages 15 to 19, participate annually. Since its inception, the league has had 10 million players, and nearly 75 percent of current college players are program graduates.

Legion Baseball serves the young people who play it. In college scholarships, the league annually awards a total of \$51,000 - \$1,000 for a player selected from each department based upon leadership, character, scholarship and financial need. Recently, the Legion passed a resolution allowing corporate sponsorship in hopes of creating more college financial aid. Gatorade already funds \$10,000 in scholarships for the Legion Baseball Player of the Year and the eight regional players of the year.

In 1949, the national player of the year was first named through the arrangement of Robert Quinn, director of The National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum. Winners receive a trip to the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y., making them the only amateur athletes invited to the exhibit. The award is now named after George W. Rulon, who served as program coordinator from 1961 to 1987.

Three other recognition awards were established in the 1970s: the Dr. Irvin L. "Click" Cowger RBI Award, the Rawlings Big Stick Award, and the Bob Feller pitching awards. All recognize strong performances in the regional and national tournaments.

Over the years, plenty of other major corporations have joined Gatorade in sponsoring Legion Baseball. In the 1940s, Ford Motor Co. dealers supplied uniforms for local teams. Easton Sports recently signed on as a sponsor, and Baseball Factory has agreed to scout Legion players with big-league aspirations.

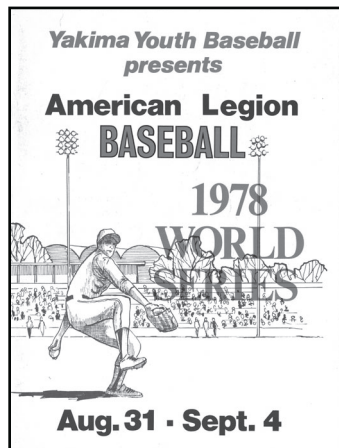
**A PRESTIGIOUS PEDIGREE:** Major League Baseball has sponsored Legion Baseball almost since its inception, and Legion Baseball has returned the favor, churning out major-league prospects. The number of former Legion players who have gone on to the pros is too large to chart. More than half of current major-leaguers played Legion Baseball. So did almost every working MLB manager and several former commissioners. More than 50 graduates are in the Baseball Hall of Fame.

Naturally, Legion Baseball's alumni base includes some of the sport's most recognizable names, with Yogi Berra, Ted Williams, Frank Robinson, Mark Teixeira, Ryne Sandberg, Roy Campanella, Dusty Baker, Albert Pujols, Greg Maddux and Chipper Jones among them. Babe Ruth was too old to join when Legion Baseball started, but spent the final years of his life promoting the program.

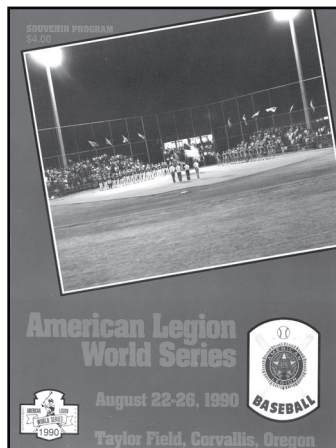
Of all the notable former players, Legion Baseball had perhaps the greatest impact on former Cleveland Indians great Bob Feller, who said the experience taught him as much about life as it did baseball. Legion Baseball gave him a chance to form lifelong friendships, learn to deal with letdown in athletic competition, and become better prepared for the strain of fighting in World War II in the U.S. Navy.

The first Legion alumnus elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame, Feller expressed his love and appreciation for the league after it honored him with a plaque in 1962, writing: "Truthfully, I feel I should have given a plaque to The American Legion rather than receiving one from it."

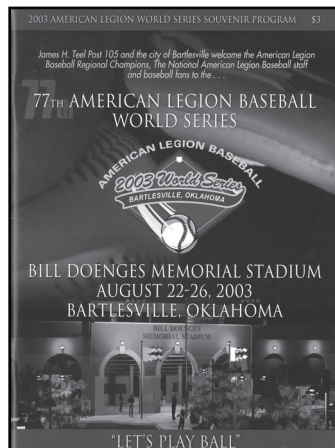

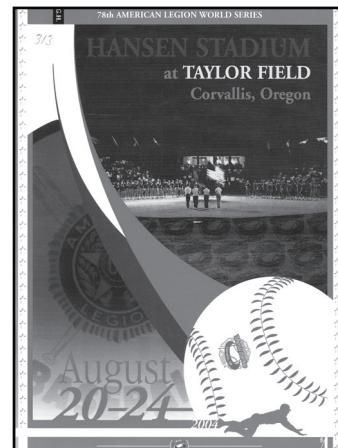

## WHY 'MARKETMEN'?

It's a question that begs to be asked: with the team being sponsored by Gerding Builders, why is the Corvallis American Legion baseball squad nicknamed the Marketmen?

Two reasons.

When Richey's Market closed in the fall of 2010, the firm then known as T. Gerding Construction stepped forward to become the program's sponsor. With Richey's Market having been affiliated with the program for over 40 years, the Marketmen tag had become synonymous with American Legion baseball in Benton County. To retain some of that identity, Tom Gerding graciously agreed to continue with not just the blue-and-gold color scheme, but also with the nickname.

The Marketmen moniker is also a nod to the Gerding family history. For many years prior to the start of the construction company in 1969, the Gerding family operated markets in various locations around Corvallis.

# SALUTING RICHEY'S MARKET

They were only a few feet from the ice cream, frozen pizzas and television dinners - dozens of the reasons that Richey's Market became synonymous with American Legion baseball success in Oregon.

One could stand in front of the freezer case at the supermarket on Circle Boulevard, gaze upward, and see trophy after trophy that was won under the sponsorship of Richey's Market. The hardware represented six state titles, three regional championships, a pair of third-place national finishes, a fifth-place finish, five state runner-up finishes, and uncounted tournament victories.

When Jack and Vera Richey retired and Richey's Market closed in September, 2010, it marked the end of an incredible run of support by the family and the store. Corvallis American Legion Baseball remains grateful for the long relationship. For 42 seasons, the Richey family helped provide not only on-field opportunities for

young ballplayers, but a summer diversion for local families and a passion for other baseball fans.

Richey's Market was first the sole sponsor of the American Legion baseball team in Corvallis in 1970 and the Marketmen responded by winning the program's first-ever state title.

On May 27, 1970, the Corvallis Gazette-Times reported that the Richey's Market team would begin practice under head coach Bob Clark. The Marketmen opened the season at Hansen Stadium at Taylor Field on June 2, being swept by Newport; they picked up their first win a day later at Hillsboro.

In the ensuing decades, Richey's Market was honored several times as Oregon's Sponsor of the Year for American Legion baseball; that included the 2009 season, when the Marketmen won their sixth state title.

In 2011, T. Gerding Construction took up the mantle of sponsorship, continuing a proud baseball tradition in Corvallis.

# SALUTING THE HANSENS & McCLAIN

Three of the people responsible for making the Marketmen of Corvallis Post No. 11 into one of the nation's top American Legion Baseball programs were Gene Hansen, Helen Hansen and Dick McClain.

Gene Hansen - with the constant aid of his wife, Helen - served as general manager from 1978-2003. McClain served as head coach of the Marketmen from 1978-2005. Under their guidance, Corvallis became one of the rare programs to play in an American Legion World Series it hosted, in 1990.

Gene Hansen - who could always be found by listening for his trademark "Hubba Hubba!" around the ballpark, was instrumental in the community's effort to make improvements to the ballpark. The name of the ballpark was amended to Hansen Stadium at Taylor Field in Gene and Helen's honor in 2002.

Gene Hansen passed away in the spring of 2004 while working at

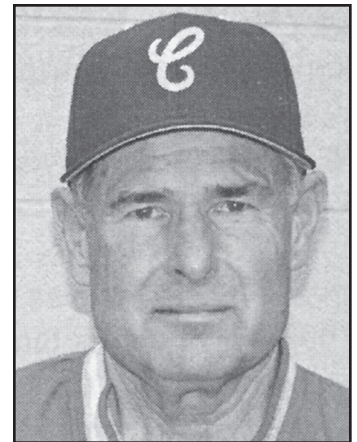

men to state championships, regional titles and places in the ALWS in 1978, 1990 and 2003; he also guided Corvallis to three state runner-up finishes.

McClain also coached a pair of Portland teams to the ALWS, including the 1969 national champions. In 2005, Corvallis retired jersey No. 9 in honor of the man known as "Niner."

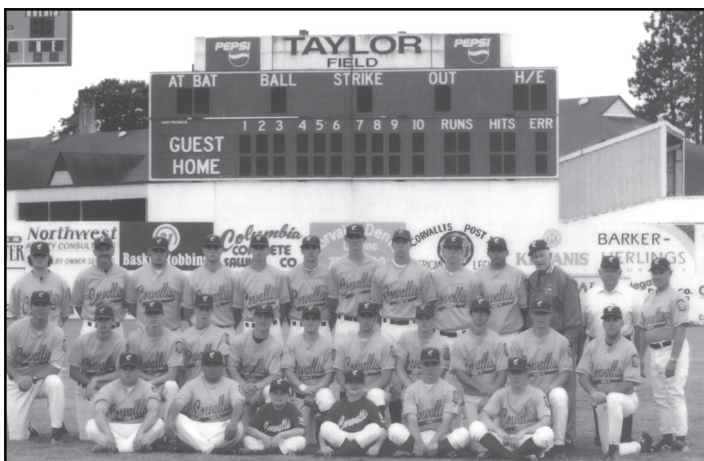
